Call to Action

ChildFund International and the Big Ideas Coalition for Women and Girls composed a letter to Administrator Power regarding the USAID Youth in Development Policy and the updated Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment Policy. These policies contained commendable language highlighting the intersection of youth and gender. However, there have been concerns about push-backs in Congress, particularly affecting adolescent girls. The purpose of this letter is to express appreciation for the agency's work in updating the Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment Policy, thank the Administrator for the agency's efforts, and urge her to take the following actions:

- 1. Elevate and prioritize the policy throughout the Agency's programs and commitments by integrating and fostering capacity for the policy across all departments.
- 2. Provide annual public and transparent reports on the progress made in implementing the policy.
- 3. Regularly engage and consult with U.S. based and local partners, with a special focus on women- and girl-led organizations.

Quick Summary

USAID Deputy Administrator Isobel Coleman announced that the United States is pledging an additional \$100 million to support Pakistan's recovery efforts from the devastating 2022 floods. The new pledge includes both new and redirected funding. \$79.3 million from USAID will prioritize urgent support for agriculture and food security, health, economic growth, education, protection, and governance. Additionally, \$20.7 million from the State Department will provide humanitarian assistance for flood-affected Afghan refugees and host communities in Pakistan. This new funding will reach over 20 million flood-affected individuals to assist in their recovery, risk reduction, and resilience. In addition, this funding will support humanitarian partners to provide nutritious food to mothers and their children, help families rebuild local infrastructure to protect them from future disasters, and increase protection services to prevent gender-based violence and support survivors. U.S. First Lady Dr. Jill Biden traveled to the Middle East, North Africa, and Europe to promote empowerment for women and education for young people. In Egypt, Dr. Biden met with Egypt's first lady, Entissar Amer, and President Abdel Fattah el-Sissi before visiting a technical school in the capital. The visit also aimed to highlight U.S. investments in education programs. During one of her events, Dr. Biden delivered a speech at Al-Azhar Mosque in Cairo, Egypt, to young leaders. Drawing from her experience as a community college writing teacher, Dr. Biden shared two assignments she gave to her students to better understand them: The first assignment asks students to reflect on their hometowns and what has shaped them andthe second assignment is inspired by "This I Believe," where individuals share their deeply held beliefs. She expressed her belief in the youth of Egypt and their potential to contribute to various fields and emphasized the power of faith, understanding, and common ground in building stronger communities. UNICEF <u>published</u> its report that provides guidance on integrating the Early Childhood Development Index 2030 (ECDI2030) into Demographic and Health Surveys (DHS). The ECDI2030 was developed by UNICEF to measure early childhood development and monitor progress towards the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) target of ensuring equitable access to quality early childhood development and learning opportunities by 2030. The report highlights the history, development, and validation of the ECDI2030, which involved extensive consultations with experts and national statistical authorities. The report explains the analysis and reporting process, focusing on the indicator that summarizes developmental outcomes across health, learning, and psychosocial well-being domains. It also emphasizes the need to disaggregate data by demographics and subnational areas to identify disparities in developmental outcomes among children. To read the report, click <u>here</u>.
